Established in 2001, the ILF is a leading global advocate for the right to counsel. Our mission is to make justice a reality for poor people by fighting to guarantee high-quality legal representation for everyone arrested or detained. Globally, we provide high quality criminal defense services, partner with civil society organizations, and build sustainable, effective legal aid institutions. The ILF is headquartered in New York, and currently has public defense offices or programming in Afghanistan, Indonesia, Myanmar, Nepal, Palestine, and Tunisia. Through the work of its dedicated public defenders, the ILF is effectively defending the most vulnerable people in societies around the world and advancing the culture and practice of lawyering on a global scale. Our work prevents human rights abuses such as torture, protects the rights of the accused, and results in access to free, high-quality, client-centered representation for indigent children and adults. About the Internship

Interns will be exposed to a range of work in one or more countries relating to direct representation, strategic litigation, and/or policy advocacy. Intern responsibilities may include but are not limited to drafting legal memos or other communications; engaging in legal research and writing; providing support for lawyer training programs; and developing advocacy tools. This internship provides a unique, valuable opportunity for hands-on learning in a global public defense organization that provides high quality legal aid to people in need.

The internship is open to U.S. law students (1Ls, 2Ls, 3Ls, LL.Ms and SJDs). The ideal candidate is a team player, comfortable in a fast-paced environment and possesses:

- A passion for public defense and the rights of the accused
- A demonstrated commitment to social justice and human rights
- Strong organizational skills, ability to think strategically and execute tactically
- Excellent communication, research, and writing skills
- Excellent interpersonal and cross-cultural communication skills

Prior experience interning, externing, or taking clinical coursework in criminal defense/public defense (anywhere in the world) is a plus. Currently, due to COVID-19, the ILF's internship program is remote, but we are looking at providing in-person placement opportunities in New York and/or other countries as the situation allows.

Details:

- Language: English is required; proficiency in additional languages is an advantage.
- Funding: The ILF Global Internship Program is unpaid and travel expenses are not provided. Candidates are strongly encouraged to seek external funding.
- Dates: Applications for **the Spring Semester** are now being accepted on a rolling basis until internships are filled.

- To apply, please send a resume and cover letter, in English to internships@theilf.org.
- In your cover letter, please explain your familiarity with/commitment to human rights, indigent defense, international justice, community-based organizing, and/or access to legal aid. Resumes should indicate oral and written language proficiency.
